Happy Thanksgiving

Twenty five years have passed since the very first meeting at The Club in 1991. The following is a look back to the beginning.

The Baptist Health System Retiree Organization had its humble beginning in 1991 when Barbara Hunsley had a vision of an organization that would allow BHS retirees to continue their relationships and fellowship with other former employees. She shared her vision with her senior manager, Tom Sanders. After much discussion about the organization's structure and objectives, it was agreed that BHS would support such a group and appointed Bill Page as the President and Frank Hinkley as Parliamentarian. Hinkley was assigned to lead the development of the organization's by-laws. Barbara Hunsley was appointed as the group's BHS liaison. Letters were sent to all BHS retirees to solicit interest and with many responding. Starting with an initial small group, work continued to define and build the membership. The first meeting was scheduled for November at The Club in that same year.

This meeting was a very special one in that it was the beginning of what we have today! The organization's objectives have not changed much over the past 24 years. Thanks to the determination and hard work of many people over the years, BHSRO is on the upswing and getting stronger each year!

The following is an article that was written by Mike Easterling in 2002 reminiscing about that first meeting:

Smiles, hugs and sparks of recognition were exchanged at the first meeting of the BHS Retiree's Organization at The Club in the fall of 1991.

Nearly a hundred of what President Emmett Johnson called "our most import assets" turned out for the event organized by Meeting and Travel Services Manager Barbara Hunsley.

"Those of us remaining in the harness are striving to keep up the good work and sustain the

heritage which those of you who have gone before us established." Johnson told the retirees in a personal letter read by BHSRO chairman, Bill Page. "You retirees are the foundation upon which those of us presently working at the BHS facilities have received our inspiration, instruction, motivation and commitment to our purpose," Johnson wrote. "We thank God for you."

Bill Page, who retired from BHS in 1985 as vice president of corporate services, says he and others who served on the steering committee "have wanted something like this for a long time."

"We thought the best way to decide how we wanted the organization to be structured would be to talk to retirees and get their ideas and comments," Page says. Surveys were sent out to BHS's 600 retirees with 200 replying. "There was a substantial interest in the organization with 60 percent of those willing to accept leadership positions," he says. "They told us they wanted to stay a part of the BHS family."

Those attending the luncheon heard and approved the organization's objectives and voted on the resolution of incorporation unanimously. A committee was established to develop a draft of the constitution and bylaws at the next scheduled meeting to which all retirees will be invited.

Ida Parrot, who retired from Princeton nursing service after 35 years, says, "I think an organization is a good way for us to keep up with what's going on at BHS."

Blanch Borders, a 41-year veteran of Montclair medical records, agrees. "I was walking across the plaza to a meeting when it hit me," says Borders. "I was getting ready to retire and it struck me that I hated being cut off from BHS. That's when I knew I wanted an organization for retirees. I'm very enthusiastic about this new organization. It's needed and greatly appreciated."

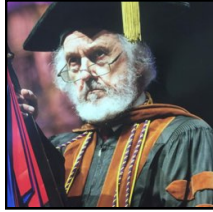

Remedy Center is a non-profit affiliate of the Birmingham Baptist Association that gives away durable medical equipment to those in need.

The ReMEDy Center is a non-profit ministry of the Birmingham Baptist Association in cooperation with the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services' STAR program. The Center opened its doors in Birmingham in 2009 at the former site of Central Park Baptist Church in Ensley.

The ReMEDy Center seeks to involve churches in an ongoing effort by the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services (ADRS) to provide pre-owned medical equipment to people in need. ADRS's STAR (Statewide Technology Access and Response) program accepts donations of medical equipment and places the items on a monthly inventory list available online. The equipment is then loaned to family members, caseworkers, school employees and others around the state who work with individuals with both long- and short-term disabilities or illnesses.

Churches and their members can help the ReMEDy Center find and collect equipment, help find people who need to be loaned this equipment and can help pick up or deliver within their communities. Services such as these allow churches to be good neighbors. In addition, if a church has unused space, it has the option to serve as a collection or distribution site as well.

The ReMEDy Center's long-term goal is to form partnerships with at least one church in every Alabama association in order to collect and loan equipment both to individuals in its community and around the state. In addition to church partners, the program also needs volunteers to locate equipment and people in need of equipment. A volunteer organization is essential to achieving and maintaining the ReMEDy Center's goal of providing durable medical equipment at no cost to those who need it.

The Remedy Center is open Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 10 a.m. till 4 p.m. Please call or email before coming, because staff members are often out picking up donated items.

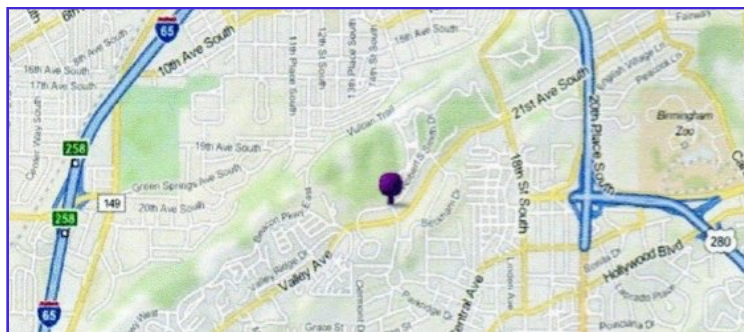

Baptist Health Foundation Update

In 2017, Baptist Health Foundation will celebrate its 50th anniversary of providing philanthropic resources for the Baptist Health System. With the Brookwood Baptist Health joint venture, the Foundation is now positioned to focus its resources on providing patient care, education, and furthering faith based wellness in the communities served by Brookwood Baptist Health.

One of our newest initiatives is the creation of a Patient Assistance Fund. This fund provides resources to help with patients' take home medications, transportation, medical equipment and other needs as identified by social workers and case managers for those patients who lack the financial resources. We recognize that for these patients, there can be a significant gap between what they need and what they can afford.

In just two months, we have raised \$145,000 from employees and physicians and received matching funds and seed money that have put the total funds available at \$450,000. But more importantly, we have provided hospice care, cancer medications, wound care nursing, home health care, transportation, diabetes medications, psychiatry medications, insurance to cover rehabilitation, and cremation expenses for patients throughout our five facilities. Through these funds, the Foundation is continuing its long history of caring for those who need us most and furthering the healing ministry of Jesus Christ.

Foundation representatives will join us at our November meeting to provide more information and answer any questions.

Brookwood Baptist "Healthy Over Hungry" Drive

Brookwood Baptist Health collected 96,495 servings of cereal and more than \$14,000 to provide area children and adults struggling with hunger during the summer. Its "Healthy Over Hungry" Cereal Drive benefitted the Community Foodbank of Central Alabama, which is a member of Feeding America. The drive ran June 3-10, 2016.

"I am so proud of all of our colleagues for an outstanding effort to tackle childhood hunger through our 'Healthy Over Hungry' Cereal Drive," said Keith Parrott, chief executive officer of Brookwood Baptist Health. "Our mission is and always will be to restore good health to those we serve. Because good nutrition is essential to good health, we wanted to join the fight against hunger and shed light on a very real issue currently affecting one in six residents of our 12-county region."

BBH's generous donation helped provide 17,800 meals, releasing that extra burden on these families. "We are thrilled that so many will now be helped because of the system's leadership in addressing this community health issue," said Parrott.

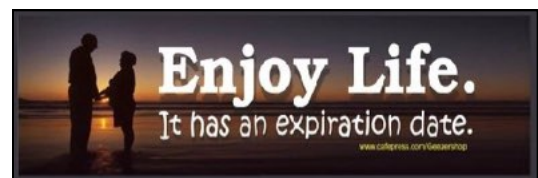

The Lily of the Cahaba Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution is one of more than 10,000 commemorative partners of the Vietnam War Commemoration. In the past year, this Hoover-based DAR chapter has provided more than 200 Vietnam veterans with certificates of appreciation and lapel pins in honor of their service to our country.

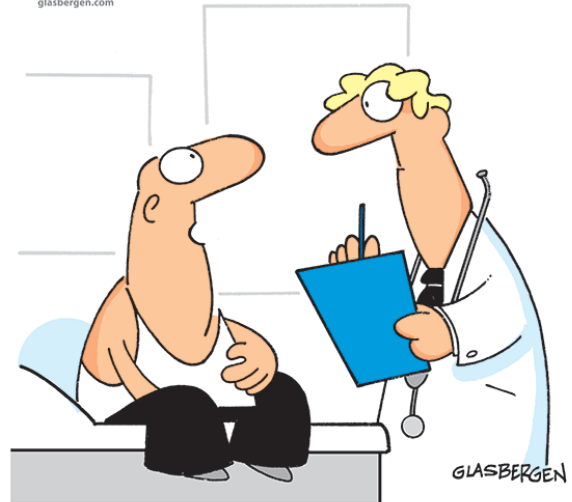

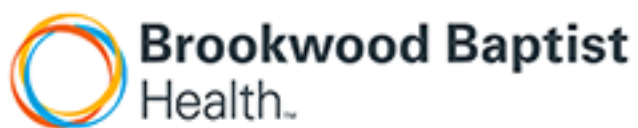
